

## ACS Student Chapters Model Calendar for the 2012-2013 Academic Year

The ACS National Office will assist your chapter's efforts by providing substantive, financial and administrative support whenever possible. To that end, we have developed this calendar of suggested activities and important dates throughout the year. We recommend that chapters focus on expanding chapter membership through their events. Although what is most effective will vary from city to city and state to state, chapters should host at least one event per month. Some events may involve a single speaker; others might involve panel discussions or debates. Social/networking events are also included in the calendar. Additionally, ACS is committed to promoting diversity through its student chapters. Programming should be planned with the goal of appealing to a diverse audience, both through the content of the program and the invited speakers. Finally, your chapter should seek co-sponsorship of events with other organizations at your school to build successful events that help to grow membership and expand diversity efforts (e.g., ACLU, Law Students for Reproductive Justice, women's/GLBT /disability /diverse student groups).
